This year is the 100th anniversary of the establishment of the first Finnish Consulate in Shanghai. Finnish-Chinese relations in that time and especially in the last few decades have turned almost upside-down. Before China was a developing country, and Finland represented the modern West, but now China has become technologically superior in some fields and is no longer a student.
