Alexandre Coelho reveals how China's strategic institutional bypass works through analysis of the London RMB Offshore Center.

Alexandre Coelho is a Professor of International Relations and the Head of the Geopolitical Analysis Center at the Brazilian Think Tank Observa China (China Observer). He holds a PhD in International Relations and a Masters in Law, and is a specialist in Politics and International Relations, with extensions in Geopolitics, International Politics, and International Political Economy from Harvard University, the Geneva Institute of Geopolitics, Sciences Po, and New York University. He also has extensive experience in international financial markets, having worked at the Bank of China-Brazil, the São Paulo Stock Exchange (B3), and Safra Financial Group. During his Ph.D., he was Visiting Researcher at the University of Toronto, and his thesis conclusions have been presented at several conferences on Asian Studies and International Relations worldwide, including Harvard, the International Studies Association Conference in Montréal, and the virtual International Political Science Association Conference. He is also an Associate Fellow at the Geoeconomics Society in Helsinki and Secretary of the Asian Studies Committee at the International Political Science Association (IPSA). Additionally, he serves as a guest editor for the Macau Journal of Brazilian Studies and coordinates the Geopolitical Analysis Center at the Brazilian think tank Observa China.

<u>China Crossroads</u> hosts talks on all topics related to China, including business, foreign policy, and other areas as they relate to China, the idea being that China is both already a "crossroads" of the world and itself at a "crossroads" in terms of its future global influence.
